- Capacity strengthening

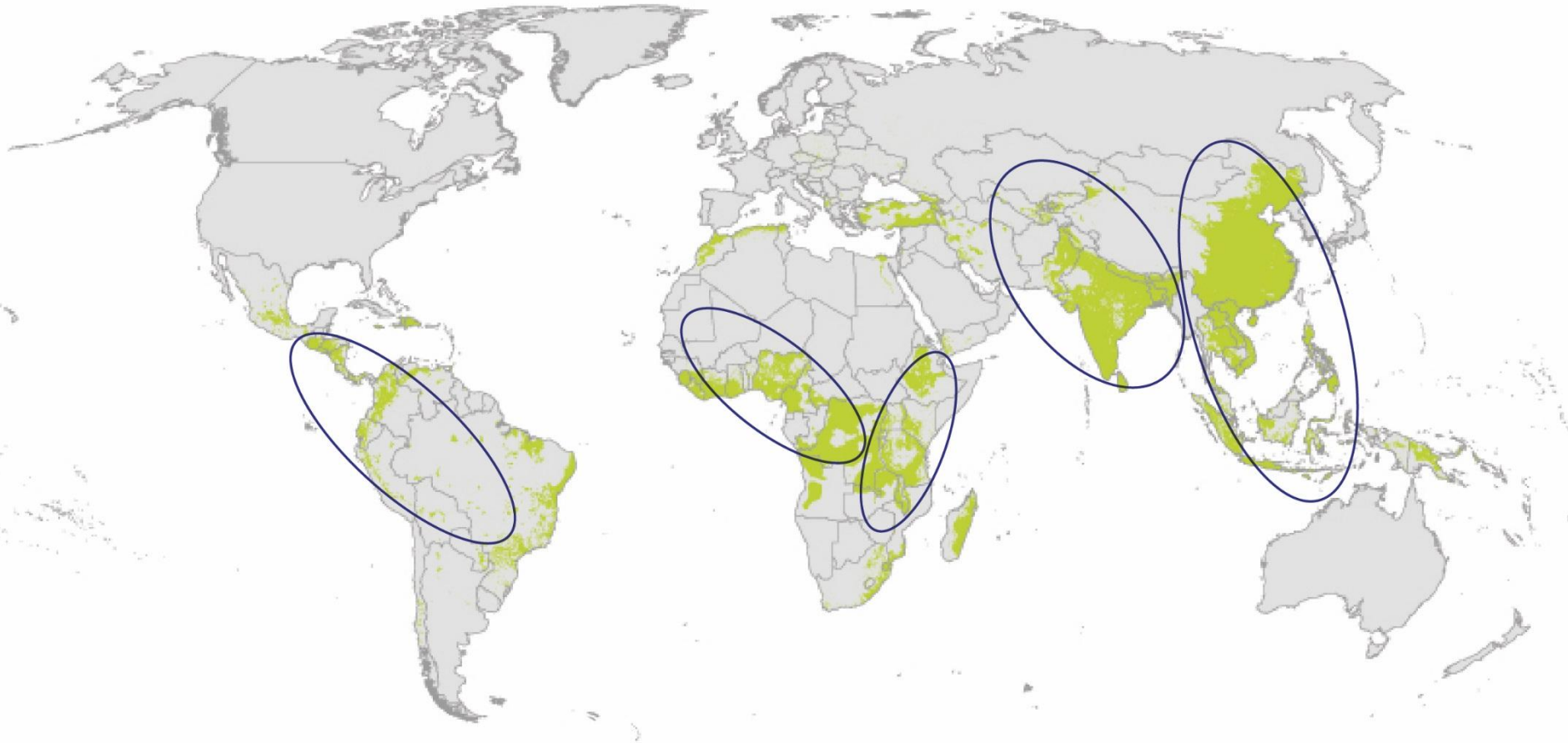

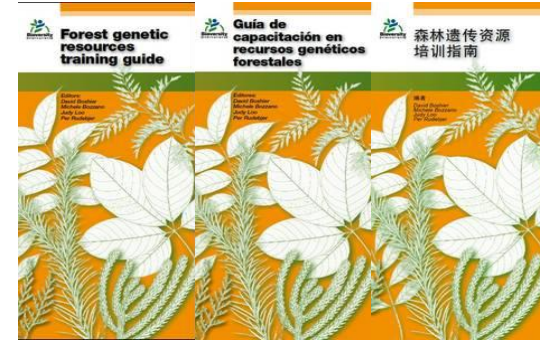
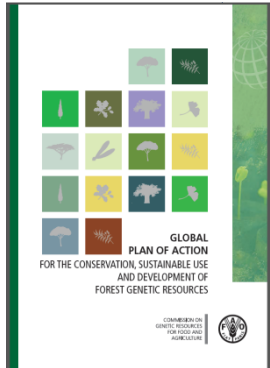

LAFORGEN – Latin American Forest Genetic Resources Programme (Network); Working groups developed to work on strategic priorities of GPA; training is high priority; 4 training workshops to test the FGR Training Guide



APFORGEN – Asia Pacific Forest Genetic Resources Programme (Network); Working groups established and strategy for implementation of GPA



SAFORGEN – Sub-Saharan African Forest Genetic Resources Programme (Network); Training is high priority; capacity development important aspect of all Bioversity projects
